09.15-10.15 Newmarket, St Mary the Virgin, 6 (GF), 21-0-14
Address: Church Lane, Newmarket CB8 0HP

Parking: "If you drive down Church Lane you will be in a municipal car park, which costs 60p to park for two hours. There are other car parks around Newmarket, which all charge the same."

There is a toilet in the church hall which can be opened if needed.

Parking: "Parking is outside the church, space for up to 20 cars I should think."

Chemical toilet in shed only and access not guaranteed!

Parking: "Please can you park in the community centre car park to the rear of the church."

Toilet in community centre can be made available.

**16.00-17.00 Bury St Edmunds, Cathedral Church of St James & St Edmund
(The Norman Tower), 12, 27-2-5**

Address: Angel Hill, Bury St Edmunds IP33 1LS (NB the postcode in Dove is IP33 1LY and "the entrance to the Norman Tower, which is situated alongside the Cathedral as a detached tower, is through the gate at the roadside end of the fencing around the tower. Go to the left-hand side of the Tower after entering the gate and climb the stairs to the entrance")

Parking: "Parking on Angel Hill is expensive, but free for blue badge holders (up to 30 minutes £1.50, up to 1 hour £2.20, up to 2 hours £3.50). The cheapest long stay car park nearest to the Tower is Ram Meadow, Cotton Lane, IP33 1XP (up to 2 hours £1.50, up to 3 hours £1.80). From Ram Meadow you can walk towards the town centre which is signed from there through the Abbey Gardens, takes about 10 minutes to walk to the Tower. There is very little free street parking, most parking is residents only or some free for 1 hour. However I am told that St Botolph's Lane is free street parking and is about 10 minutes walk."

There are toilets in the Abbey Gardens, on the Angel Hill side, or in the cloisters of the Cathedral, near to the Pilgrims Kitchen refectory.

We will be collecting donations of £1 per tower on the day.
