

Previously on Moving past Cambridge...

- 1) There are only 4 different Backworks which can give Standard Regular Surprise Minor
- 2) They also give the legal backworks for Standard Regular 4ths Place Delight
- 3) There are plenty of other backworks, they just break the rules, so are not in the Standard set of methods.
- 4) The first 3 blows of the lead can be different, but after that, until the half lead, you are restricted in what you can ring, without breaking the rules.
- 5) The backworks are generally known as
Cambridge
Carlisle
Norwich
London
- 6) Plenty of tables name the 2nd and 6th place lead end versions of the backworks with different names, but I think that is unnecessary if you understand the lead end correctly.

What Do I need to Learn?

You need to know each of the backworks VERY well.

If a change of method is called, you need to know the start of each lead.

Once you pass the treble in the second half of the lad, you need to be thinking about the work in the rest of the lead, and what you will do at the lead end.

You need to know which type of lead end it is and be prepared for a call – either Bob or Single.

This is work you can do outside the tower. Once you have all 4 backworks firmly in your mind, then you can proceed.

If you can just about remember it, then do not move on to the next chunk of learning yet.

Take your time and learn it well.
